LETTER FROM HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

Here are a few things to note for our upcoming school year:

1. School starts September 06, 2022

a. Please meet at 1019 Fernwood, TheElementary and Middle School Campus

i. this first day of school only.

b. It is our standard half-day to start with a special wind-up following our morning together

c. Sept. 07, 2022 is our first full day at Christmas Way Campus

2. There are a couple of parent meetings upcoming at the beginning of the school year on September 8, 2022. Parent 101 @ 6:00 pm and the Parent Information Session @ 7:00 pm

3. Students are expected to be in full uniforms from day one

a. If you need to purchase, update, or refresh any items, please make your orders ASAP through the Neat Uniform store.

- b. Here is a link to our current Uniform Code/Standard, which I repeat is mandatory for all students k-12.
- c. Please also note expectations for PE Uniforms
- d. With repeated uniform violations, students will be sent home to retrieve their appropriate school attire in order to be allowed to attend classes, tests, or exams. If parents cannot pick up their children, then students will be sent home through a transportation service and families will be charged to their account.

4. The School Day schedule is the same as last year

- a. Students arrive at 8:15 am
- b. Classes are finished by 2:50 pm
- c. Students must be off campus by 3:30 pm, unless they are meeting with staff for pre-arranged appointments, such as extra-curricular activities, tutoring, or office hours
- d. For shuttling service, please check with our office staff

5. We have switched to a Trimester scheduling this year to better accommodate our students' learning needs and the demands of our academic requirements, this means we will be running 2 terms with three courses each for 13.5 weeks, and a final term that will have only two courses for 9 weeks at the end of the school year



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- Term 1: Sept December
- Term 2: January mid April
- Term 3: mid April June

6.. Only students in grades 10–12 may leave campus for lunch upon the completion (which means submission) of the Off-Campus at Lunch Permission form. Grade 9 students are not included in this privilege.

7. We will be continuing with our ban on mobile devices during school hours, as this demonstrated a significant improvement in students behaviour and academic success.

a. If students are using mobile devices when they are not supposed to be, meaning in the classrooms or during breaks in class or between classes, then these devices will be confiscated and taken to the office

b. If students want to retrieve their devices, they may do so with either a minimum donation of \$5 to a charity of the school's choice, like our school's Compassion Sponsor Child, or a parent/guardian may pick-up the device at the end of the school day. 8. Students are expected to be present with their classes during the school day. Although we did have an exception granted for online learning during the government ordered lockdowns, it has been widely proven that the best learning environment for the average student is in the classroom with their teachers and peers.

a. This means that if your child is sick, please stay home and focus on resting and getting better

b. If you are needing to be away from school for non-medical reasons, the school will not be providing auxiliary services beyond the standard class notes, it is impossible to reproduce the quality of learning provided by live, interactive, in-person learning.
9. Families who are planning trips during the school year must fill out a Vacation Request Form for their children from the office, to be reviewed and approved by the principal.
